Mission

Harvest House exists to restore hope and dignity by equipping families to overcome crisis and build lasting stability.

Renters in our area are more cost burdened than ever—meaning they spend more than 30% of their income on housing.¹

The food insecurity rate in Texas rose from 16.4% to 17.6%, affecting 5.3 million Texans. Notably, 1 in 5 children and 13.6% of seniors are food insecure.²



Programs

Food Pantry - Harvest House addresses food insecurity by providing groceries to families in need, delivering food bundles to seniors in low-income housing, and partnering with eight local food ministries to extend our reach across the community.

Financial Aid - Our Financial Aid Program offers emergency assistance to families facing crisis, helping them cover essential expenses like rent and utilities so they can remain safe and stable during difficult times.

Clothing Vouchers - Through our Resale Store, families in need receive vouchers to select gently used clothing, shoes, and household essentials. We also partner with multiple local organizations to provide support for their clients.

Getting Ahead - In 2025, we launched a 20-week small-group course that helps participants develop the tools needed to achieve lasting financial stability and break the cycle of poverty.

Life Skills Education - We offer classes in English as a Second Language, financial literacy, and other practical skills that equip individuals to build confidence, stability, and independence. These classes empower participants to thrive in daily life and pursue long-term success.

Chris first came to Harvest House through community service but quickly became part of our family. After volunteering and receiving help through the pantry, he joined our inaugural Getting Ahead class and graduated with pride. Today, Chris serves as our truck driver—giving back to the same community that once supported him.



We envision a community where families move beyond crisis into resilience and contribution.


